# Dolton Park District Community Interest and Opinion Survey Executive Summary

#### **Overview**

ETC Institute administered a community interest and opinion survey in the Fall of 2020 for the Dolton Park District. This assessment was administered as part of the District's efforts to develop a Comprehensive Master Plan to establish priorities for the future improvement of community parks, facilities, and programming. Dolton Park District's attempts to take a citizen-driven approach to making decisions will enrich the future of the community and positively affect the lives of its residents.

#### Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random sample of households in the Dolton Park District. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online at <a href="https://www.boltonParkSurvey.org">www.boltonParkSurvey.org</a>.

Ten days after the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute sent emails to the households that received the survey to encourage participation. The emails contained a link to the online version of the survey to make it easy for residents to complete the survey. To prevent people who were not residents of the District from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting the survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses that were entered online with the addresses that were originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not counted.

The goal was to obtain completed surveys from at least 400 residents. The goal was reached with a total of 400 residents completing the survey. The overall results for the sample of 400 households have a precision of at least  $\pm -4.86\%$  at the 95% level of confidence.

#### **Use and Ratings of District Parks and Recreation Facilities**

**Use.** Fifty-two percent (52% or 209) of respondents indicated they or member(s) of their household had visited Dolton Park District parks over the past 12 months.


Respondents were asked to indicate which Dolton Park District parks/facilities they had visited during the past 12 months. The three parks/facilities that were visited by the most respondents were: Main Park (25%), Dolton/Riverdale Park (20%), and Main Field House (14%). The Park District parks/facilities with the highest ratings, for their overall condition, based on the sum of "excellent" and "good" responses among respondent households who had an opinion, were: Recreation Center (85%), Main Field House (85%), and Main Park (84%).

The parks/facilities that respondents indicated they had visited during the past year, the parks/facilities that were <u>used most</u>, based on the sum of respondents' top three responses, were: Dolton/Riverdale Park (12%) and Main Field House (8%).

**Mode of Travel.** The most popular modes of travel, for respondent households, to get to parks and recreation facilities are to drive (62%) or walk (41%).

**Ratings.** Of the respondents that visited District parks (52% or 209 respondents) over the past twelve months,

- 14% rated the physical condition of District parks as excellent,
- 44% rated the physical condition of District parks as good,
- 35% rated the physical condition of District parks as fair, and
- 7% rated the physical condition of District parks as poor.




#### **Facility Needs and Priorities**

**Facility Needs**. Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 32 facilities and rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various facilities. The four facilities with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need were:

- 1. indoor running/walking tracks 2,696 households (or 31%),
- 2. indoor fitness and exercise facilities 2,681 households (or 30%),
- 3. indoor swimming pools/leisure pools 2,678 households (or 30%), and
- 4. walking and biking trails 2,655 households (or 30%).

The estimated number of households that have unmet needs for each of the 32 facilities that were assessed is shown below.




**Facility Importance:** In addition to assessing the needs for each facility, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each facility. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, the four most important facilities to residents were:

- 1. walking and biking trails (27%),
- 2. indoor fitness and exercise facilities (23%),

- 3. sidewalk/walking paths within parks (20%), and
- 4. indoor swimming/leisure pools (19%).

The percentage of residents who selected each facility as one of their top four choices is shown in the chart below.




Priorities for Facility Investments: The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on Parks and Recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on amenity/program and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the facility/program. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 3 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following eight facilities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Walking and biking trails (PIR=198)
- Indoor fitness and exercise facilities (PIR=185)
- Indoor swimming pools/leisure pools (PIR=168)
- Indoor running/walking tracks (PIR=163)

- Sidewalk/walking paths within parks (PIR=147)
- Park shelters and picnic areas (PIR=109)
- Banquet hall/large indoor venue (PIR=108)
- Cultural Arts Center for dance, theater, concerts (PIR=103)





#### **Participation and Ratings of District Programs**

**Participation.** Eleven percent (11% or 44 respondents) indicated they have, or member(s) of their household have participated in <u>recreation or sports programs</u> offered by the Dolton Park District during the past twelve months. Of the respondent households that have participated in recreation or sports programs (44 respondents);

- 43% participated in at least 1 program,
- 48% participated in 2 to 3 programs,
- 2% participated in 4 to 6 programs, and
- 7% did not provide this information.

The households that participated in recreation/sports programs in the past 12 months (11%) were asked the primary reasons their household participated in these programs.

- 64% of these respondents indicated it was because of the location of the program facility
- 32% of these respondents indicated it was because friends participated in the program
- 30% of these respondents indicated it was because the quality of the program facility

**Participation in Recreation Programs.** Responding households were asked to indicate all of the recreation programs (offered or co-sponsored by the District) that they/their household had participated in during the past 12 months. Thirteen percent (13%) participated in Jazz in the Park, 9% participated in Steppin' in the Park, and 8% participated in the Community Flea Market. Of the respondents that indicated they had participated in recreation programs (sponsored or cosponsored by the Dolton Park District),

- 41% participated in 1 program/activity,
- 30% participated in 2 to 3 programs/activities,
- 7% participated in 4 to 6 programs/activities,
- 2% participated in 7 to 10 programs/activities,
- 3% participated in 11 or more programs/activities, and
- 18% did not provide this information.

Ratings of Sports Programs. Sixty-four percent (64%) or 28 respondents, that participated in recreation/sports programs, rated the overall quality of the recreation or sports programs as either excellent (23% or 10 respondents) or good (41% or 18 respondents). Thirty-two percent (32%) of the participating households rated the overall quality as fair and 5% rated the overall quality of recreation/sports programs as poor.

Ratings of Recreation Programs. Of the respondents that participated in recreation programs (30% of respondent households), over half (58%) gave the overall quality of recreation programs, offered or co-sponsored by the Park District, an excellent (13%) or good (45%) rating.


#### **Program Needs and Priorities**

**Program Needs**. Respondents were also asked to identify if their household had a need for 33 programs and rate how well their needs for each program were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had "unmet" needs for each program.

The four recreation programs with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need were:

- 1. farmers market 2,457 households (or 28%),
- 2. senior (55+ years old) programs 2,313 households (or 26%),
- 3. fitness exercise classes 2,164 households (or 24%), and
- 4. Concerts in the Park 1,923 households (or 22%).


The estimated number of households that have unmet needs for each of the 33 programs that were assessed is shown in the chart on the next page.



**Program Importance.** In addition to assessing the needs for each program, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each program. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, the four most important programs to residents were:

- 1. senior (55+ years old) programs (27%),
- 2. farmers market (21%),
- 3. Concerts in the Park (16%), and
- fitness and exercise classes (14%).


The percentage of residents who selected each program as one of their top four choices is shown in the chart on the following page.



**Priorities for Program Investments.** Based on the priority investment rating (PIR), which was described briefly on Page iv of this Executive Summary and is described in more detail in Section 3 of this report, the following eight programs were rated as "high priorities" for investment:

- Senior (55+ years old) programs (PIR=194)
- Farmers market (PIR=180)
- Fitness exercise classes (PIR=142)
- Concerts in the Park (PIR=139)
- Movies in the Park (PIR=116)
- Water fitness programs (PIR=111)
- Swim programs (PIR=110)
- Fitness in the Parks (PIR=104)

The chart on the next page shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 33 programs that were rated.



#### **Additional Finding**

**Potential Barriers to Facility and/or Program Use.** Responding households were given nineteen (19) potential barriers/reasons that keep them/their household from using the parks, recreation, and sports facilities/programs of the Dolton Park District more often. The top <u>five</u> responses were: "I do not know what is being offered" (29%), "security is insufficient" (22%), "too busy/not enough time" (19%), "fees are too high" (18%), and "lack of quality programs (16%).

Facility/Park Amenity Needs. Over the next five to ten years, the facility/park amenities that respondent households feel are needed in the community, are: an exercise park (58%), all kids park (41%), and a club house (35%). The facility/park amenities that respondents feel are most needed and have been used most during the past year are: exercise park (26%), all kids park (20%), and dog park (11%).

**Potential Improvements.** Responding households were asked how they would budget spending \$100 on Parks District improvements. Respondents prioritized funding as such:

- \$28.32 for upgrading existing parks and park amenities,
- \$23.22 for developing new indoor facilities,
- \$18.73 for upgrading existing indoor facilities,
- \$15.91 for improving existing sports fields, and
- \$13.82 for expanding existing indoor facilities.

**Method of Learning.** The top three most popular ways that respondent households learn about Dolton Park District programs, activities, and events are: flyers (40%), word of mouth (36%), and Park District program guide (34%). The methods of communication that are most preferred by respondent households, based on the sum of respondents' top three choices, were: flyers (32%), Park District program guide (29%), Dolton Park District website (24%), and Park District email blasts/newsletters (23%).

**Communication.** Respondents were asked to rate the effectiveness of the District's marketing ang communications efforts.

- 8% of respondents believe the District's efforts have been very effective
- 12% of respondents believe the District's efforts have been moderately effective
- 22% of respondents believe the District's efforts have been somewhat effective
- 15% of respondents believe the District's efforts have been not very effective
- 10% of respondents believe the District's efforts have been not effective at all
- 32% of respondents are not sure how effective the District's efforts have been

**District Website.** Respondents were asked to rate the level of effectiveness of the Dolton Park District website.

- 8% of respondents believe the website has been very effective
- 9% of respondents believe the website has been moderately effective
- 12% of respondents believe the website has been somewhat effective
- 6% of respondents believe the website has been not very effective
- 5% of respondents believe the website has been not effective at all
- 59% of respondents are not sure how effective the website has been

**Perception.** From a list of eight (8) different words, respondents were asked to select which words describe the Dolton Park District, and the top responses were: convenient (41%), open space (36%), and gathering space (31%).

**Satisfaction with Elected Officials and Staff.** The highest levels of satisfaction with Park District officials and staff, based on the sum of "very satisfied" and "somewhat satisfied" responses among residents *who had an opinion*, were: administrative front desk staff (40%), Recreation Center staff (38%), Recreation Center front desk staff (37%), and maintenance staff (37%).

The levels of satisfaction that respondent households have with the overall value they receive from the Dolton Park District are:

- 6% are very satisfied,
- 14% are satisfied,
- 26% are neutral,
- 6% are dissatisfied,
- 7% are very dissatisfied, and
- 41% indicate they do not know.

#### **Conclusions**

To ensure that the Dolton Park District continues to meet the needs and expectations of the community, ETC Institute recommends that the District sustain and/or improve the performance in areas that were identified as "high priorities" by the Priority Investment Rating (PIR). The facilities and programs with the highest PIR ratings are listed below.

#### **Facility Priorities**

- Walking and biking trails (PIR=198)
- Indoor fitness and exercise facilities (PIR=185)
- Indoor swimming pools/leisure pools (PIR=168)
- Indoor running/walking tracks (PIR=163)
- Sidewalk/walking paths within parks (PIR=147)
- Park shelters and picnic areas (PIR=109)
- Banquet hall/large indoor venue (PIR=108)
- Cultural Arts Center for dance, theater, concerts (PIR=103)






# Q1. Have you or any member of your household visited any parks of the Dolton Park District over the past 12 months?






# Q1a. Overall, how would you rate the physical condition of ALL of the parks of the Dolton Park District you have visited?

by percentage of respondents that have visited District parks during the past 12 months (without "not provided")




# Q2. Please CHECK ALL the ways you and members of your household travel to the parks and recreation facilities you use.

# Q3. Have you or other members of your household participated in any recreation or sports programs offered by the Dolton Park District during the past 12 months?




# Q3a. Approximately how many different recreation or sports programs offered by the Dolton Park District have you or members of your household participated in over the past 12 months?

by percentage of respondents that have participated in District recreation or sports programs during the past 12 months




### Q3b. Please check the THREE primary reasons why your household has participated in Dolton Park District recreation or sports programs.

# Q3c. How would you rate the overall quality of the recreation or sports programs that you and members of your household have participated in?








# Q5. Please indicate all of the recreation programs offered or co-sponsored by the Dolton Park District that your household has participated in during the past 12 months.




# Q5a. Of the programs selected in Question 5, how many different recreation programs offered or co-sponsored by the Dolton Park District has your household participated in during the past 12 months?

by percentage of respondents that participated in a recreation program in the past 12 months




## Q5b. How would you rate the overall quality of recreation programs offered or co-sponsored by the Dolton Park District that you have participated in?

by percentage of respondents that participated in a recreation program in the past 12 months




### Q6. Households' Facility Needs

# Estimated Number of Households That Have a Need for Various Facilities



### Q6. How Well Facility Meet the Needs of Respondent Households


by percentage of respondents with a need for facilities


# Estimated Number of Households Whose Needs for Facilities Are Partly Met or Not Met


### **Q7. Facilities Most Important to Households**

by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top four choices




### Q8. Households' Program Needs

by percentage of respondents (multiple choices could be made)




# Estimated Number of Households That Have a Need for Various Programs


### Q8. How Well Programs Meet the Needs of Respondent Households

by percentage of respondents with a need for programs (using a scale of 1 to 5, where 5 means your needs are "100% Met" and 1 means "0% Met.")




# Estimated Number of Households Whose Needs for Programs Are Partly Met or Not Met


### **Q9. Programs Most Important to Households**

by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top four choices




# Q10. Please indicate if you or any member of your household has used any of the following Dolton Park District parks/facilities during the past 12 months.


#### Q10. If "YES," please rate the condition of the parks/facilities.

by percentage of respondents using a scale of 1 to 4, where 4 means your needs are "Excellent" and 1 means "Poor" (without "don't know")




# Q11. Which THREE of the parks/facilities listed in Question 10 have you or members of your household USED MOST during the past year?

by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top three choices




### Q12. Please CHECK ALL of the following facilities/park amenities that you feel are needed in the community over the next five to ten years.



by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top two choices




# Q14. If you had a budget of \$100 for services provided by the Dolton Park District, how would you allocate the funds among the categories of funding listed below?


### Q15. Please CHECK ALL of the following ways you learn about Dolton Park District programs, activities, and events.

by percentage of respondents (multiple choices could be made)





## Q16. Which THREE of the communication methods listed in Question 15 do you MOST PREFER to use to learn about Dolton Park District programs, activities, and events?

by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top three choices




## Q17. How would you rate the effectiveness of the District's marketing and communications efforts?






### Q18. How would you rate the effectiveness of the Dolton Park District website?

by percentage of respondents




### Q19. Please check THREE things that come to mind when you think about Dolton Park District.


#### Q20. Satisfaction with Dolton Park District Elected Officials and Staff





## Q21. Please rate your satisfaction with the overall value your household receives from the Dolton Park District.

by percentage of respondents




## Q22. How likely would you be to recommend Dolton Park District programs and activities to a friend?







### Q23. Demographics: Counting yourself, how many people in your household are...

by percentage of respondents





#### Q24. Demographics: What is your age?






#### **Q25.** Demographics: Your gender:






#### Q26. Demographics: Which of the following best describes your race/ethnicity?




### Q27. Demographics: Which of the following best describes the primary languages spoken in your home?




### Q28. Demographics: In what other language(s) would you like to see Dolton Park District materials translated?

by percentage of respondents (multiple choices could be made)




### Q29. Demographics: Please CHECK ALL of the descriptions below that best indicate your household's employment status.

## Section 2 Benchmarking Analysis

## Benchmarking Summary Report Dolton Park District (Dolton, Illinois)

Since 1998, ETC Institute has conducted household surveys for needs assessments, feasibility studies, customer satisfaction, fees and charges comparisons, and other parks and recreation issues in more than 400 communities in 49 states across the country.

The results of these surveys has provided an unparalleled data base of information to compare responses from household residents in client communities to "National Averages" and therefore provide a unique tool to "assist organizations in better decision making."

Communities within the data base include a full-range of municipal and county governments from 20,000 in population through over 1 million in population. They include communities in warm weather climates and cold weather climates, mature communities and some of the fastest growing cities and counties in the country.


"National Averages" have been developed for numerous strategically important parks and recreation planning and management issues including: customer satisfaction and usage of parks and programs; methods for receiving marketing information; reasons that prevent members of households from using parks and recreation facilities more often; priority recreation programs, parks, facilities and trails to improve or develop; priority programming spaces to have in planned community centers and aquatic facilities; potential attendance for planned indoor community centers and outdoor aquatic centers; etc.

Results from household responses for the Dolton Park District (Illinois) were compared to National Benchmarks to gain further strategic information. A summary of all tabular comparisons are shown on the following page.


by percentage of respondents



% of households who have visited parks and recreation parks/facilities operated by local governments in their community during the past year


#### **Overall Ratings for Parks** Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents (without "don't know")




## Program Participation Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents




#### **Overall Ratings of Programs** Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average


## Households with Needs for Sports Facilities Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents with a need for sports facilities




## Households with Needs for Other Recreation Facilities Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents with a need for other recreation facilities




## Households with Needs for Other Recreation Facilities Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents with a need for other recreation facilities




## Households with Needs for Other Recreation Programs Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents with a need for other recreation programs




## Households with Needs for Other Recreation Programs Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

by percentage of respondents with a need for other recreation programs




# Method of Accessing Information About Recreation Programs and Activities Dolton Park District (Dolton, IL) vs. National Average

# Section 3 Priority Investment Ratings (PIR) Analysis

## Priority Investment Rating Dolton Park District (Dolton, Illinois)

The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide governments with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on parks and recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating was developed by ETC Institute to identify the facilities and programs residents think should receive the highest priority for investment. The priority investment rating reflects the importance residents place on items (sum of top 4 choices) and the unmet needs (needs that are only being partly or not met) for each facility and program relative to the facility and program that rated the highest overall. Since decisions related to future investments should consider both the level of unmet need and the importance of facilities and programs, the PIR weights each of these components equally.

The PIR reflects the sum of the Unmet Needs Rating and the Importance Rating as shown in the equation below:

For example, suppose the Unmet Needs Rating for indoor running/walking tracks is 100 (out of 100) and the Importance Rating for indoor running/walking tracks is 63 (out of 100), the Priority Investment Rating for indoor running/walking tracks is 163 (out of 200).

#### **How to Analyze the Charts:**


- **High Priority Areas** are those with a PIR of at least 100. A rating of 100 or above generally indicates there is a relatively high level of unmet need and residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements in this area are likely to have a positive impact on the greatest number of households.
- Medium Priority Areas are those with a PIR of 50-99. A rating in this range generally
  indicates there is a medium to high level of unmet need or a significant percentage of
  residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas.
- Low Priority Areas are those with a PIR below 50. A rating in this range generally
  indicates there is a relatively low level of unmet need and residents do not think it is
  important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements may be warranted if






# Top Priorities for Investment for Facilities Based on the Priority Investment Rating




